Introduction

This collection was given to the Liberty Aviation Museum by Bill Meixner, of Cleveland, Ohio. Permission to use this collection for research purposes was granted by the donor.

Biographical Sketch

This collection features archives donated by Bill Meixner, a local historian from the Cleveland, Ohio area. The content of this collection consists of archives all pertaining to the Cleveland National Air Races, with dates starting as early as 1929. Meixner is well known for his work concerning the history of these races. Meixner also serves on an executive committee, for the Cleveland chapter of the "Society of Air Racing Historians International." The Society of Air Racing Historians International, was founded in 1984 and its mission is to preserve the complete and accurate records of air races, race pilots and race planes by working together and combining the knowledge of many people. The history of air racing can be dated back as far as 1909, in Reims, France. After a full week of air racing, word traveled fast about this new sport. (Berliner) In the following years, the interest in air racing grew exponentially and air racing events began to pop up all across the world. Beginning in 1929, Brothers Cliff and Phil Henderson directed Americas National Air Races at Cleveland Municipal Airport. The races featured pylon races, cross-country races, aerobatic acts, military demonstrations, novelty races, as well as band concerts and firework displays.

This collection also features prints of Charles H. Hubbell's artistic works. Hubbell (1899-1971) was a native to Cleveland, Ohio area and is well known for his aviation inspired artworks. In Cleveland, Hubbell also worked with Thompson Products to paint the winning aircraft each year from the Thompson Trophy Race. Hubbell was also commissioned to do calendars and many other masterful works of art. (WRHS)

Scope and Content

This collection was donated by Bill Meixner, a local historian from Cleveland Ohio. Included are items about the Cleveland National Air Races as well as, periodicals with dates beginning in the 1920's. Other items in the collection consist of printed works by Charles H. Hubbell, various articles, photographs, and printed materials. This collection forms an insight into beginnings of air racing in Cleveland Ohio. It shows how this sport blossomed and continually grew each year.
